

# **INSTRUCTIONS ON CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE OF ARTFUEGO® PRODUCTS**

## **CLEANING OF TOOLSETS AND WOOD BASKETS MADE OF POLISHED AND SATINATED BRASS**

Accessories made of polished brass are not lacquered due to their expected contact with flames. That is why their spontaneous darkening (patination) and loss of gloss due to contact with moist and sweaty palms, is entirely natural phenomenon.

In order to maintain the original shine for as long as possible, the surface of a product should be regularly preserved with vaseline or cooking oil. One should soak a cotton cloth in oil and then softly wipe the surface of a product.

Darkening or stained accessories made of polished or satinated brass may be cleaned with any commercially available cleaning preparation intended for brass, and then preserved with vaseline, cooking oil or wax.

## **CLEANING OF TOOLSETS AND WOOD BASKETS MADE OF PATINATED BRASS**

It's forbidden to use preparation intended for brass in case of patinated accessories, since it may damage or adversely affect the aesthetic value of our product.

Patinated products shall be dusted with a soft cloth and in case of dirt it's enough to wipe the surface with soft moist cloth and then preserve with vaseline, cooking oil or wax.

## **CLEANING OF TOOLSETS AND WOOD BASKETS MADE OF BRASS FINISHED IN "OLD GOLD"**

Accessories finished in „old gold“ shall be dusted with a cloth.

Harder dirt shall be removed with fine sponge/scrubber made of delicate fibre metal, always in accordance with the direction of the original pattern on the surface of a product.

## **CLEANING OF FIREPLACE FLOOR PLATES**

Floor plates made of brass and steel are additionally protected with varnish. That is why in case of getting dirty it's enough to wipe them with dry or delicately moist cloth.

## **CLEANING OF ACCESSORIES MADE OF INOX STEEL**

Accessories made of inox steel may be cleaned with moist cloth and then preserved with vaseline or cooking oil.

In case of stronger dirt commercially available cleaning preparation intended for inox steel may be used. Upon removing dirt from the product it may also be preserved with vaseline or cooking oil.
